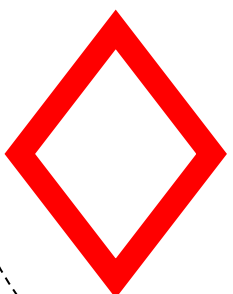
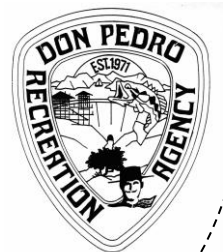


EXTREME FIRE DANGER!

Don Pedro Lake, with over two million acre-feet of water storage is the fifth largest reservoir in the state of California. Don Pedro is surrounded by a federally licensed project boundary. All lands and water within this boundary constitute the Don Pedro Recreation Area. Don Pedro is one of the few lakes in the state where lakeshore camping along undeveloped shoreline is still permitted. Abiding by all Regulations and adhering to safe, courteous and sanitary practices will not only protect the surrounding environment, but will also help to ensure that this privilege of Lakeshore camping at Don Pedro can continue.

- Undeveloped Recreation Area lands and water are considered the "Dispersed Area".
- Permitted camping on Dispersed Area Recreation Area lands outside of the Fleming, Blue Oaks and Moccasin Campgrounds is "Lakeshore Camping".
- Lakeshore Camping is prohibited in developed areas, below private homes, near roadways, where posted and where indicated on the map.
- A current Lakeshore camping permit is required for every Lakeshore campsite, 8 persons maximum per permit.
- All applicable camping, vehicle and vessel permit use fees shall be paid at Recreation Area entrance stations prior to setting up campsite.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited in the Dispersed Area.
- Quiet time is 10 pm to 7 am, respect your neighbors and keep your noise level to a minimum.
- No person shall occupy a campsite for more than 14 consecutive nights.
- Portable furnishings, structures and vessels shall not to be left unattended overnight.
- Absolutely no ground fires or wood fires are permitted in the Dispersed Area!
- 10 foot clearance required around all portable camp stoves, barbecues and any open flame.
- Campsites shall be kept clean and free of all loose debris, trash and litter at all times.
- Before leaving the Dispersed Area, Campers shall remove all of their trash then dispose of it properly at developed Recreation Area dumpsters.
- Dogs shall be kept on a leash at all times and shall not be left unattended.
- Dispersed Area restrooms shall only be used for their intended purpose.
- Do not tie vessels to floating restrooms for more than 15 minutes at a time and do not camp, jump, dive, swim or fish from them.
- Do not dump trash, diapers or porta-potty contents in Dispersed Area restrooms.
- Do Not use the shoreline as a toilet!
- Self-contained portable toilets are required for all campsites that are not near restrooms.
- Porta-potty contents may be disposed of at campground dump stations and marina pump-out facilities.
- Keep off adjacent private property and any area posted "closed" or "no trespassing".
- No person shall use any weapon, except for hunting or fishing purposes in accordance with applicable laws, within the Recreation Area.
- All target shooting and other weapon use is prohibited within the Recreation Area.
- Vessel operators shall comply with all applicable boating laws and regulatory markers.
- Mooring your vessel to, moving or damaging any regulatory buoy is a violation of the law.
- Don Pedro Lake is a reservoir; the lake level is always changing and many hazards are not marked, always **watch for submerged objects, rocks, islands, floating debris and reduce your vessel speed when operating in unfamiliar areas and at night!**

DON'T MOVE A MUSSEL!

Quagga/zebra mussels

ruin boats and destroy waters

DON'T LET THEM RIDE WITH YOU!

Watercraft and equipment can move quagga and zebra mussels from infested waterbodies to uninfested waterbodies. If spread, these mussels can:

- Encrust boat hulls, clog cooling systems, jam steering equipment
- Alter aquatic ecosystems, resulting in fewer native species and sportfish
- Litter beaches with sharp, foul smelling shells
- Clog water distribution systems, resulting in higher utility bills

DON'T SPREAD INVASIVE SPECIES

You can prevent the spread of quagga and zebra mussels using this checklist every time you exit a waterbody:

- Inspect all watercraft and equipment**
- Clean any visible mud, plants, fish or animals from watercraft and equipment**
- Drain all water, including from lower outboard unit, ballast, live-well, buckets, etc.**
- Dry all areas**
- Dispose of debris and live bait in the trash**
